#### Advent:

Andrew-John Bethke writes about Advent:

The season of Advent has traditionally heralded the beginning of the western liturgical year. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin phrase *Advent Domini* – literally "the coming of the Lord"

#### Symbols used during the season:

- 1. **The colour purple** is used for both Advent Lent, but the two seasons "push towards different goals". Some churches choose to use "blue for Advent to avoid any confusion with Lent"
- 2. **The Advent wreath** with an underlying symbol of "the gathering of light over successive weeks, signifying the imminent dawn of Christ's coming.
- 3. **The simplicity of Advent** is observed pointing to "the simplicity of Christ's birth" and therefore there is no flowers in the church in the secular world the opulence of Christmas is in full swing, but inside the church there is a starkness which is a visible contrast"
